He made a number of beads and coves in the piece and then split the piece before rejoining it and continued the turning. He hollowed the end and finished with Libron Woodturner's Finish and wax.

The members appreciated the hard work Alan put into developing a novel demonstration. The end result of Alan's demonstration was a fine open vase that can grace any mantle.

rings, maple box, very large balusters for a porch restoration, joined with epoxy, cherry box with inlay plugs and purple heart top.

Joe DeMaio Mahogany bowl hand rubbed with tung oil, natural edge oak bowl, two maple bowls.

Carl Saenger Two sassafras natural edge bowls finished with shellac and Deft.

Arnold Winters Hiking stick from pyracantha, notched and stained to bring up the grain.

Martin Rost Two cherry plates friction polish finish, tired maple candy dish.

Joel Rakower Textured walnut burl bowl.

Marty Mandelbaum Spalted maple bowl.

Bill Holland Milo sculpture stitched together, Plum three legged sculpture, Cherry heavily carved and textured bowl with leaf pattern with lacquer finish.

Charlie Panzner Segmented bowl using 22 Long Island woods, segmented vase from walnut, maple dogwood and sassafras.

Ken Deaner Assorted carved, pierced and textured maple, cherry and poplar bowls and vases, large wide rimmed platter heavily carved and textured, two small wide rimmed platters carved and textured. Ken and Joe DeMaio vase, textured and carved.
