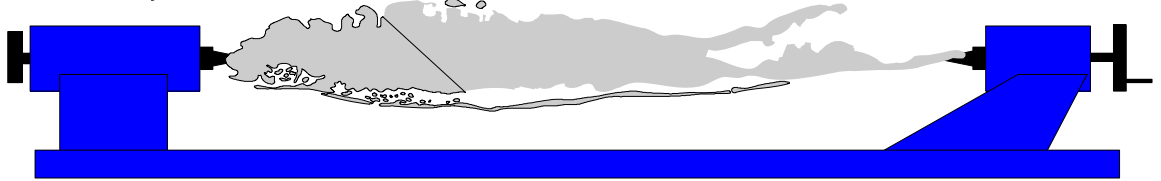

All participating members are asked to write a brief resume which will appear in the gallery show.

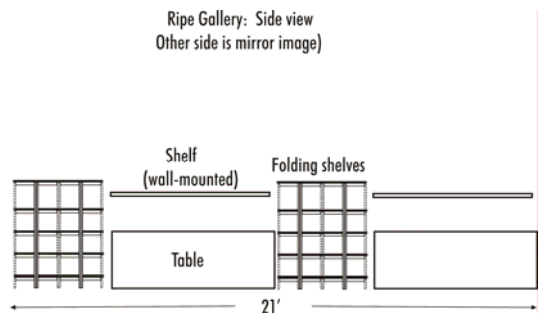
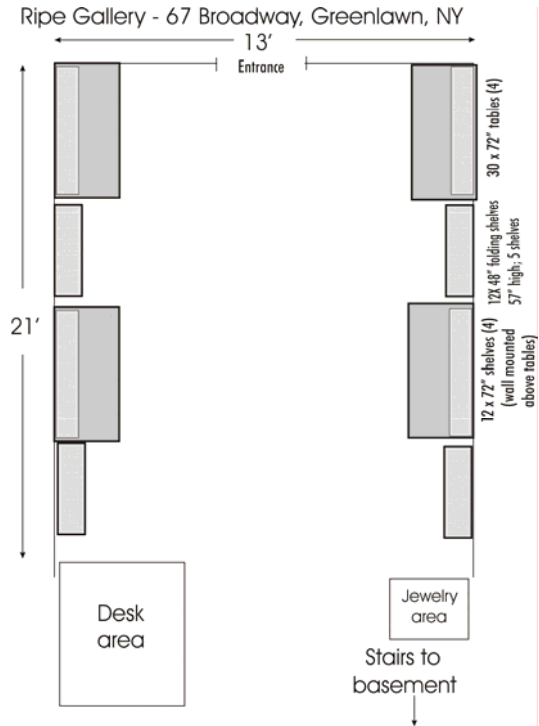
Plans for the LIWA display at the Ripe Gallery in Greenport, January 9 through early February, 2010:

1. Ken Deaner, Les Hoffman, John Kowalchuk, Charlie Panzner, and Don Lindsley visited the Ripe Gallery on October 3 to meet Cherie Via (the owner), look over the space, and make tentative plans for the display. Les verified that the gallery's insurance policy covers items on display up to a maximum of \$25,000. The main gallery space is 13 by 21 feet; there is also a sales counter and a jewelry display case that would be suitable for items like pens, bottle stoppers, and bangle bracelets. There is also a basement that could be used for display if we have too many items to display in the main gallery.

2. We decided to use four 2.5 by 6 foot tables, four folding shelves, and four wall-mounted shelves for display in the main gallery; see the attached diagrams. I have one table and one set of folding shelves, and will make a second set of shelves. Les Hoffman has generously volunteered to make another set of folding shelves, and to procure the wall-mounted shelves. We need 3 more tables, and someone to make the 4th set of folding shelves.

3. All items for display should be brought to the November (Nov. 21) or December meeting (Dec. 19), so that we will have them in hand in order to set up the display during the first week of January. We'll ask at the October meeting who intends to display and whether the items will be for sale.

Peter Schultheiss-3 segmented bowls

Jim Macallum-segmented bowl, desk pen, homemade pin chuck for pen making

Ken Deaner-black walnut bowl w/oil finish, oak bowl, maple pot

Steve Fulgoni-2 piece thin walled vessel w/ lacquer finish, turned poppy flower

Bob Brady-2 hollow forms of poplar, several dishes, bowls, and several hollowed bowls w/ burned decorations

Tiberio Yepes-vessel made of brass shavings and resin glued and turned, multi-layered veneered plate

Paul MacMenamin-maple bowl, curly maple bowl, 3 tiered lidded rosewood box

Lenny Mulqueen-cherry burl bowl

Les Hoffman- 3 buckeye burl bowls and vessels, maple vase vase-turned, colored and carved, black walnut bowl

Carl Saenger-cherry burl natural edge bowl, 2 laminated cabinet grade plywood bowls

John Kowalchuk-segmented bowl of maple, tulipwood & purpleheart

Parvis Mehran-segmented vessel

Greg Nicharico-segmented vessel

September Demonstration Martin Rost

Martin turned several conical shaped trees. Martin turned these pieces using the cross grain for a more appealing appearance.

He used a variety of tools including small spindle gouges, parting tools and a small scraper.



Martin mounted the blanks to be turned with glue blocks plus jam chucks to finish the bottom of the tree. Blanks can also be mounted directly into a four jaw chuck.



Martin likes to work with small turnings. These pieces need to be precise and sized proportionately to give a pleasing scale and appearance. While small in size, these turnings yielded a beautifully finished turning.

Martin recommends that only 70 % of the outside be turned down to allow for hollowing .

He mentioned that any and all turning tools be used to achieve the desired outcome.

Thanks Martin, for an interesting and informative demonstration.
